ZION UNITED REFORMED CHURCH OUGHTIBRIDGE

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE CHURCH

At the bottom of Orchard Street, Oughtibridge, near to the bridge which crossed the river Don, was a small workshop known as the "Tip and Shuttle Shop" and here seems to have been the origin of Zion, the oldest Free Church in the village. A few devout men of vision, after holding outdoor meetings near the bridge, must have felt the desire for a building in which to worship God, for it is recorded that the foundation stone of our present Church was laid on the 11th March 1833 by Mr George Grayson, who became one of the first Church members. The proceedings were conducted by the Rev. David Dunkerley, who afterwards became the first pastor of the Church.

Even in those days building seems to have been carried out in remarkably short time, for the Church was opened for public worship on the 18th July 1833, just over four months after the laying of the foundation stone. Three services were held that day; morning, afternoon and evening, but it was at the afternoon service that the Church was formed on the principles of Independency with a formal covenant, the last words of which are "To make the New Testament our only rule of conduct and judgement."

These first members set for themselves high standards, for it is recorded that 1835 that the Church decided to hold no further communion with Mary Denton, a member of the Church, because of her marrying an "unbeliever," "until she repent and confess her sin."

Four years after the foundation of Zion, its first pastor, Rev. D. Dunkerley, resigned his charge and emigrated to Canada.

Nothing is known of the next twenty five years for the next recorded event in July 1862, when a meeting was called for the proper formation of the Church, six persons being present.

The result of this meeting was that those who wished to join the new formation were required to state in writing their religious experience and reasons for preferring this section of the Church to any other. Rev. R. C. Lumsden (Howard Street 1856-63) was adjudicator at this examination and he later preached a sermon on "The end for which the Christian Church is formed and the way in which that end is to be attained". An address was also given by the Rev. J. B. Paton (Wicker 1854-63) on "The nature and design of Church fellowship". The Church was then formed and it consisted of nine members.

In June 1879 a meeting was held under the chairmanship of Rev. T. W. Holmes (Tabernacle 1872-1912) together with members of the Village Preachers Association to enquire into irregularities in the manner in which members had been admitted into the fellowship. The result being that the Church was re-formed yet again; This time at a service presided over by Rev. Peter Whyte (Queen Street 1872-85).

It was also during this year (1879) that a further piece of land was purchased for the erection of a seperate building to be used as the Sunday School. Ten more years were to elapse before this building was completed.

The years immediately before and after the end of the nineteenth century were prosperous years in the history of the Church. It is recorded that it had "a large band of loyal members and workers" when in the year 1900 it was decided to have an entirely new interior.

The straight high-backed pews, sloping floor and under-drawn ceiling were all removed and replaced with new pitch pine pews and pulpit. A new floor and ceiling, two new porches, a vestry and heating system were also added. The whole scheme was completed by 30 January 1901 at a cost of £600. John Eaton, Lord Mayor of Sheffield performed the opening ceremony, whilst Alderman Batty Langley J.P., M.P., opened the new vestry.

In 1905 a small pipe organ was also obtained at a cost of £130.

Two years later and after talks with Worrall Church it was decided to become linked in a joint-pastorate with Rev. A. Antrobus as pastor, and so after nearly forty years Zion once again had a minister.

The following year 1908 the first wedding was solemnized between Mr James S. King and Alice Maude Morton. Mr King was to serve Zion for sixty four years as Church secretary and organist. Indeed he still serves, for this short history is largely the result of his work when recording the events of the first one hundred years in 1933.

With the end of the second world war in 1945 and with a steady decline in membership and children attending Sunday School, the "Sunday School Queen" was instituted in 1950 and has continued ever since. These young girls during their year of office, have all raised considerable funds for the Church and can still be relied upon to serve Zion. Some of course have left our district, but on occasions return to fulfil some specific task.

In 1960 our Sunday School obtained a new "Banner" made for it by one of the members, Mrs M Bolton. This is a splendid piece of embroidery, depicting on one side "The Tree of Life",

richly decorated with flowers, a squirrel and butterfly and the kneeling figure of a child looking upwards.

From 1948 with the exception of the years '65 - '70, Zion has been fortunate to have had ministers for the time being of Stocksbridge to give oversight, taking one service a month and chairing meetings and special events. Of these ministers, Rev.R.A. Hopley is remembered with warm affection, returning a second time after his official retirement to give oversight for a further three years.

During these years the Church yard became more and more overgrown, Grave stones leaned at all angles and the whole presented a depressing sight. Into this area came one of our younger and more vigorous members. He was already organist and taking a very active part in the life of the Church. Together with two friends, he organised and cleared the entire Church yard. Laying grave stones flat, grassing the area and finally planting small shrubs.

His work was hardly finished, before the Lord issued His final great call to Barrie Glossop at the early age of 29 years.

5th October 1972 and still another beginning. On this day The United Reformed Church of England and Wales was formed and Zion became a member Church of it. Few of our members can have realised that day what changes were in store for Zion. From being a very small village Church, following its own ways with little or no direction from the centre or district, it now receives information on every possible subject.

The 1975 Assembly of the U.R.C. asked that Synods and Districts study the long term effects of a gradual decline in the number of ministers and how best to implement the "Basis of Union" proposals that "The U.R.C. take steps to see that as far as possible ordained ministers are readily available to every local Church.

The result of this was that on 21st February 1977 Rev.L.T. Johnson convened a meeting of six Churches which was held at Zion and attended by nineteen Elders.

From this meeting "Group Five" of the South Yorkshire District of the Yorkshire Province was born. Thanks to the enthusiasm of the two ministers Rev. L.T. Johnson and Rev. R. Royston-Bishop and the late Mr C. W. Hamilton of Trinity, convener of the steering committee, although, we must not forget the help given by Rev. Charles McCurdy.

The name "Group Five" soon gave way to "Sheffield West" and the six Churches - Trinity, Oughtibridge, Stocksbridge, Hillsborough, Loxley and Crookes and their congregations started the task of getting to know and to work with each other, with the intention of developing jointly and severally their obligations in Mission, Evangelism, Outreach and Worship.

On Saturday 10th May 1980, the Induction and Thanksgiving Services for Rev. B.W. Saunders, who had joined the group and Rev. R. Royston-Bishop, who had become its Chairman on the retirement of Rev. L. T. Johnson, took place at Loxley.

The following year on 28th August 1981 Rev. D. Parkinson was inducted to the Group Ministry, again at Loxley, and so West Group had for the first time its complement of three ministers.

Prior to the formation of West Group, the membership at Zion numbered eighteen. To-day it numbers twenty eight and together with adherents and the congregation is often in excess of fifty with twenty five or more children attending Sunday School, their teachers being dedicated young married women with children of their own.

The future of Zion and the wider Church is in their hands. The duty of us, an older generation, is to help with all the means in our power.
