Edward Hoyland W2 9 Anglican Edward Hoyland, who died in 1898 aged 59, served with the 34th Foot (the Border Regiment) and was a veteran of the Crimean War and the Indian Mutiny. He took his discharge in 1875 and was awarded a pension of a shilling a day after 20 years' service. The Sheffield Independent (October 25, 1898) listed his medals: 'The Crimean Medal with clasp for Sebastopol, the Turkish Medal and the Mutiny medal with clasp for Lucknow' but he fell on hard times and had been 'receiving relief from the Friends of the Crimean and Indian Mutiny Veteran Association for some time'. He was buried at their expense. Sheffield General Cemetery, gencem.org.
