Chapter 5: Unnatural assault reporting in the London Press.

'He had not himself recently read in the newspapers of an account of a similar charge made by a policeman against a gentleman, nor had he heard any other person read any account of that transaction' The Times 1842

The statement concerned the trial of Private William Youl [sic] of the Coldstream Guards, who accused William Thomas Elder, "a middle aged man of gentlemanly appearance", of making a sexual advance on him as he guarded the Tower of London. The defense attorney questioning Youl was trying to deflect suspicions from Elder by implying that Youl had fabricated his charge and was attempting an extortion similar to one reported in the newspapers a few weeks before. Youl claimed to be unaware of that earlier case, although, like many men in nineteenth century courtrooms, he was asked to speak of the relationship between his knowledge of unnatural assault and what he had read in newspapers. Youl's statements were in turn printed in newspapers for other men to read.
